



## Albany-Madison 29597 & Albany 45056 Public Informational Meeting

*NHDOT will review project impacts of the roadway safety improvements planned for NH 16 in Albany*

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) will hold a Public Officials/Informational Meeting to discuss project impacts of the safety corridor improvements to NH Route 16 in Albany and Madison. The original New Hampshire Ten-Year Plan application requested safety improvements to address crashes along NH Route 16 by implementing lower-cost rumble strip counter measures. This is the fourth planned public meeting focusing on preferred alternative impacts for the Albany 45056 NH Route 16 and Nickerson Road intersection and the Albany-Madison 29597 NH Route 16 improvements between Pine Knoll Road and Cream Brook, approximately 2.0 miles north of the Albany/Madison Town Line.

The purpose of this meeting is to discuss each project's anticipated impacts due to roadway safety improvements, required right-of-way and easement acquisitions, and traffic control to manage the construction work zone. The meeting will provide an opportunity to brief the public on the decisions and solicit public input to ensure that project decisions meet purpose and need, as well as protect and enhance the environment. The meeting will be held on **Wednesday, October 22, 2025 at 6:00 pm** following the regularly scheduled Selectboard meeting at **Albany Town Hall, 1972A NH Route 16 in Albany** and the agenda for this includes:
